# TIMES CHANGE, MEMBERS CHANGE, BUT AUXILIARY PURPOSE REMAINS THE SAME

*Purpose:* To assist the medical center in continuing to provide high-level health care services to the community

There have been many changes in what our volunteers do for the medical center. When the auxiliary was formed in 1961, the volunteers mainly provided gifts for babies born here. Knitted caps and baby books were provided to parents of all babies, and Christmas stockings large enough to hold babies were sewn for those babies born in December.

Many of our services aided clients in the Long Term Care Unit. Volunteers delivered mail, did manicures, provided refreshments and organized monthly birthday parties, transported patients to and from appointments in other parts of the medical center, and provided small gifts during the Christmas season. We transitioned this year and began assisting in Extended Care with helping decorate their department, providing gifts for residents during the year, especially at holidays, and are available when needed for activities.

Our Gift Garden is on the main floor, and we have recently added a shelf in the Clinics Lobby to showcase our merchandise. We used to staff 2 gift shops, 1 on each level 5 days a week. Our current hours at Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 10:00 am to 3:00 pm.

We have had several fundraisers throughout the years. Holiday of Lights continues to be our largest fundraiser each year in November. The Christmas Candy Sale is another popular sale, especially for Team Members. Although it was halted during Covid-19, it has been back for a couple years. Covid-19 also put a hold on our Annual Salad Luncheon for a couple years, but last year it was successfully revived, and we hope it will continue to be successful. We served close to 200 people from the community and plans are underway for September 2024.

Other fundraisers we had over the years were quilt raffles, pastry sales, jewelry sales, scrubs sales, and collective goods sales. With all our fundraising efforts and proceeds from the Gift Garden, we were able to donate \$19,150.00 back to the Medical Center in fiscal year 2024, and provide \$3,000.00 in scholarships for those pursing a healthcare career in and around Greene County.

We continue to host the Jefferson LifeServe Blood Drive, moving the location to the lobby of the Medical Center this year. The decision to host the drive in the lobby has given the Auxiliary more visibility and allows for Team Members to give blood in a more convenient location.

We continue to be available when needed for the surgery department, Public Health and other departments and tasks at the Medical Center. Our group will continue to change according to trends in the community and the population served at the medical center, but our mission will remain the same- assisting the medical center in providing high level health care to the community.


